Guidelines for a LOWA 319 Grant Request

Low Impact Landscapes and Rip Rap Requests may be initiated by a homeowner or a contractor. These projects may be anything which reduces the amount of runoff and/or contamination from entering the lake. The property must be located in a priority zone of the grant boundary area.

- Contact LOWA personnel for the 319 Grant application or download the application and guidelines from the website. Only one application may be approved for a property.
- Submit the Application, an estimate of the cost, and a description of the project, with before pictures to LOWA for their Board approval. Pictures may come from you, your contractor or a LOWA volunteer.
- You will be contacted by a LOWA Trained Volunteer Evaluator. They are there to facilitate your project for you.
- Board approval is needed prior to starting a project.
- On completion of the project submit after pictures and your paid Invoice.
- LOWA will approve the project with DNR and cut a check to you. Make sure LOWA has your correct mailing address.
- Approved Landscape Projects which come under LOWA grants could include but are not limited to:
 - Places for vegetative buffer strips
 - Rain catchment systems to include terracing and rain gardens
 - Water diversions
 - Pervious materials in place of impervious materials
- Rip Rap projects would be for rip rap on unprotected shoreline or in some cases in front of older seawalls that are failing. All rip rap projects are done to Ameren's specifications and must have an Ameren permit. DNR requires LOWA to recommend that clients plant vegetative buffer strips above riprap, and it is best that as little natural vegetation is disturbed in the application of the riprap as possible. The older seawalls need to meet some of these signs of failure to meet DNR specifications.
 - Have a structure setback of 20 feet
 - Wall is leaning
 - Have cracks in the seawall
 - Show signs of being undercut
 - Show signs of sinkholes forming above the seawall
 - Be built before 2007
- Contractors should provide their clients with before and after pictures as well as an estimate of the cost and a clear description of the scope of the work including the size of the project. Rip rap would need length and height of the rip rap, while the landscape project would include the square footage of the work to be done. Contractors provide a paid invoice after the client has completed payment. In addition, LOWA asks that contractors provide a written **10-year guarantee upon completion** of the project as DNR requires all work performed for a DNR grant to have such warranty submitted to them.
